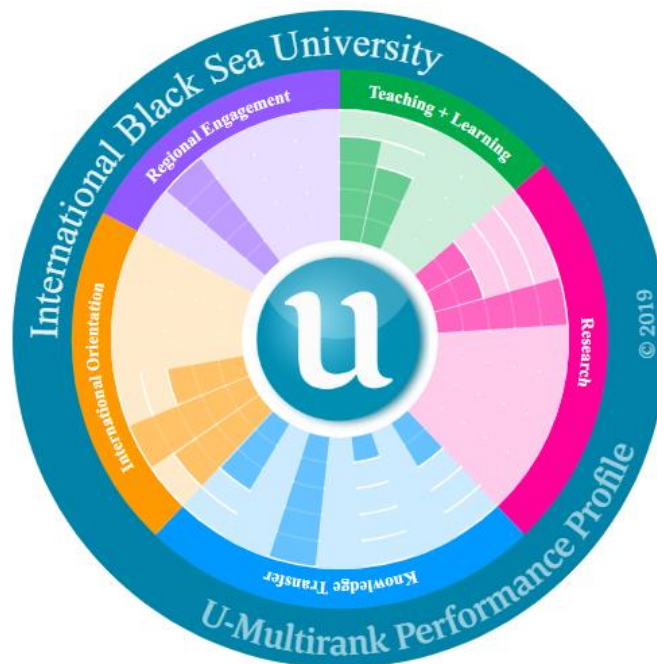


International Black Sea University

International Black Sea University is one of 6 universities included in U-Multirank for Georgia. International Black Sea University is a small private university located in Tbilisi. It was founded in 1995. With regard to the scope of its subjects and degree programmes offered, the International Black Sea University is a broad institution. It is characterized by a percentage of international students. As made clear by its sunburst chart – a snapshot illustration of the university’s performance profile across the five U-Multirank dimensions. Its overall profile shows top performance across various indicators, with 7 ‘A’ (very good) scores. U-Multirank is developed and implemented on the initiative of the European Commission by an independent consortium led by the Centre for Higher Education (CHE) in Germany, the Center for Higher Education Policy Studies (CHEPS) at the University of Twente and the Centre for Science and Technology Studies (CWTS) from Leiden University, both in the Netherlands, as well as the Foundation for Knowledge and Development (Fundación CYD) in Spain. The consortium is headed by Professors Dr. Frans van Vught of CHEPS and Dr. Frank Ziegele of the CHE.

U-Multirank is a new multidimensional user-oriented international university. It compares the performances of higher education institutions. It is used to compare university performance in five following areas:

- Teaching and learning
- Research, knowledge transfer
- International orientation
- Regional engagement.

According to U-Multirank rating, in 2018 International Black Sea University received 7 – A “very good” and B “good” in the following areas:

Teaching and Learning: timely graduation from Bachelor programs; timely graduation from Master programs;

Research: external research revenue; indexes with regard to artifacts;

Knowledge Transfer: spin-off enterprises;

International Orientation: Master programs implemented in English;

Regional Engagement: students employed in the region; student internship in the region, Strategic research partnerships in the region

U-Multirank uses a letter grading table (from A to E, where A is «very good» and E is «weak», respectively) to compare universities considering each indicator included in the rating. U-Multirank rating was first drawn in 2014; it covered more than 850 HEIs and 5,000 study programs from more than 70 countries. Development of U-Multirank was co-financed by the European Union.
